

ANS 3990A: Animal Science Internship Experience Program

Recorded Oral Presentation

Video Capture of Recorded Oral Presentation:

Students completing internship credit will be required to record themselves giving a recorded oral presentation through Canvas Studio. Your recorded presentation will then get uploaded/shared to Canvas. Students will be responsible for becoming familiar with Canvas Studio. More directions to come.

Presentation:

Please create a PowerPoint presentation and then use Canvas Studio to record yourself giving your presentation. Presentations should be well organized, formatted, and have a unique format with pictures that engage the audience. When recording your presentation, you will need to set up Canvas Studio so that way your **PowerPoint slides as well as yourself (from the waist/shoulders on up) are captured.**

Mandatory Content for your Presentation: (worth 25 points total)

- Creative title – can be the same one you used for your infographic (1 point)
- Your first and last name (1/2 point each, 1 point)
- Name of the company and/or organization you interned at (1 point)
- The title of your internship position (1 point)
- Briefly describe your internship and what you primarily did (2 points)
- What motivated you to select and complete the internship that you did? (1 point)
 - What were you hoping to take away from this experience? (1 point)
- Reflect on your strengths (these can be self-identified, or these can be the strengths identified through the ‘Strengths for Students’ report you should have access to from when you completed the student of Clifton Strengths in ANS 1100). How did your strengths assist you in completing your internship? (3 points)
 - Explain what your top 3-5 strengths are and provide two examples of how you were able to utilize your strengths throughout your internship
- Describe what your biggest challenge was throughout your internship and how you overcame this challenge (if you did). (2 points)
 - If you didn’t overcome said challenge, how are you going to improve on this in the future (if possible)?
- Reflect on your experiences and interactions with your supervisor/mentor. (1 point)
 - What do you feel makes a successful internship supervisor/mentor? (1 point)
 - Describe the positive things your mentor did throughout your internship (1 point)
- Did you receive any constructive feedback throughout your internship on how you could enhance your performance? (2 points)
 - If so, what feedback were you given and how will you use that feedback in the future?
 - If you were not given any constructive feedback, self-identify an area of

improvement that you hope to develop in the future based on your internship experience.

- Describe the one highlight of your internship that sticks out the most to you as being the most memorable. (2 points)
- How did you grow both personally and professionally from this internship?
 - Please provide 1 specific example for each (1 point each, 2 points total)
- Would you recommend this internship to other students? Why or why not? (1 point)
- Did this internship solidify your thoughts on entering this field for a potential career, why or why not? (1 point)
 - Based on your internship experience, at this time, what are your potential future career plans? (1 point)
- Please include any pictures you took throughout your internship that help illustrate anything discussed throughout your presentation or else feel free to also find pictures that are appropriate and relevant from the internet.

Clothing for Presentation Day:

Even though your presentation is going to be captured via Canvas Studio from the waist/shoulders up, you should still dress in business casual attire or else you may wear a uniform that you wore for work when recording your presentation. You should also look well-groomed for your presentation and please be mindful of what is going on in the background of your presentation (dirty laundry, distracting pets, inappropriate posters on the wall, etc.).

You will also need to upload your Presentation Slides as a .PDF with 1 slide per page to Canvas = 3 points total

Oral Presentation Delivery Criteria Rubric: 22 points total

- Student presentations will be graded on the following criteria
 - Required content discussed in-depth: 5 points
 - Delivery of presentation: speed of voice, rate, fluctuations, etc.: 5 points
 - Layout of visuals/text: easy to read/flows well, etc.: 2.5 points
 - Presentations should be 12:00 minutes in length + or – 15 seconds (so I will accept 11:45 – 12:15): 2.5 pts
 - Grammar/Punctuation: 2 points
 - Spelling: 2 points
 - Appropriate use of pictures, pictures cited if from the internet, and pictures helped enhance the presentation: 2 points
 - Student appearance during presentation – must be business casual and well-groomed: 1 point

Total Points for Oral Presentation Assignment: 50 points
